25 th Anniversary Celebration

Good evening; I am Barbara Ohlsen, President of the Decatur League of Women Voters. We welcome to our 25th Anniversary Celebration members, former members, guests and especially Mrs. Robert Ihrig, our State President. I want to honor seven members of the Decatur League who joined in 1946, our charter year. They are Mrs. James Leigh, Mrs. J. D. Mac Kechnie, Mrs. R.C. McMillen, Mrs. James Moore, Mrs. Clifford Smith, Mrs. Elbert Smith, and Mrs. I.A. Wallins, who just passed away this summer. Will these ladies please stand?

We have a bulletin board with announcements which I call to your attention. Please check it for dates of coming meetings, especially those which need reservations. On Monday, Decatur League sent a telegram to Mr. Michal Bakalis, Superintendent of Public Instruction, urging him to help get the school board and teachers together in negotiations. I urge each of you to wire him.

The League of Women Voters of Macon County was organized in April of 1946. There had been a Macon County League started in December 1923, and we have a few clippings of that group dating up to 1931, when it apparently disbanded. Therefore, we date ourselves from \$1946. The group changed its name to the League of Women Voters of Decatur in Sept. 1952, in order to be part of the lowest political sub-division in which it wished to work.

In looking back over local activities for the past 25 years, I found that many interests remain the same, while some issues have been resolved. For example, in 1947, local studies included bringing school bond issues up for a vote, the possibility of organizing a citizen's committee to select school board candidates, the desirability of making city and township boundaries identical, and work towards calling an Illinoi Constitutional Convention. We are nothing if not consistent.

In 1948, the League joined the Association of Commerce in planning a citizens committee for consideration of community affairs. Certainly fine recognition of so young a group. In 1949, the local project was a study of how taxes are collected and how tax money is used.

As the membership grew, various local issues were added to the continuing studies of schools and government. In 1952, we were concerned about city financing and also sewer bond issues. 1954 brought an attempt to have a city manager, and there were six city elections and referendums that year, with the League doing voter service work for five of them.

In 1962 we took our famous, misunderstood stand against the school building proposal referendum. Our support for a new library building started in 1965. In 1967, the League helped organize the first fourteen-hour community "hot line" radio marathon with station WDZ. In 1969, we supported the Board of Education's committment to the philosophy of racial and socio-economic integration in the public schools.

Of course you remember 1970 as the year of the big drive to adopt the new Illinois Constitution, besides local interests in our schools, housing, and water systems. I'm sure I ve left out many favorite issues some of our members here to studied or worked for. Those I mentioned were only a few of the Decatur League's activities over 25 years. Every year much money, time and effort goes to voter sevice, including many, many candidate meetings.

Our real emphasis to nite however, is on the League work ahead for the next 25 years. Taking one year at a time, we have set up displays around the room of items we will be studying or supporting in 1971-72. Karla Weinman, our Vice-president for program and action has prepared an entertaining program to show you the year ahead.

HAT PARADE

Our special guest and speaker is Mrs. Robert Ihrig, President of the League of Women Voters of Illinois. Alice was elected last April after serving six years on the state board. Prior to that, she had been president of the Oak Lawn League.

While on the State Board, her areas of work were judicial reform, election laws, and constitutional revision. Since she so successfully got the 1970 Constitution adopted, she has worked on the Governor's Task Force on Implementation of the new Constitution.

Besides these important League duties, Alice is serving as president of the Suburban Library System, president of the Illinois Library Trustee Association, President of the board of directors of the Oak Lawn Public Library, past president of the American Library Trustee Association, member of the Council of the American Library Association, Board member of the Southwest YMCA, and chairman of the Oaklawn Planning and Development Commission.

Aren't we lucky to drag her away from all these duties to help us celebrate past achievements and look ahead to years of growth and action? Welcome, Mrs. Ihrig.
